# LOCAL ARTIST SPOTLIGHT

# **BOY BOWSER**

Sherman (he/him, they/them), who goes by Boy Bowser professionally, is a hip-hop artist and burlesque dancer from Fullerton, California. Influenced by the likes of Childish Gambino, Chance the Rapper, Rico Nasty, and Linkin Park, Bowser combines his background in jazz composition with their interest in hip-hop to make their own music.

When songwriting, Bowser explains, "I usually like to start with an overarching idea. I like to have all my songs have a thematic idea to them. I'll be like, 'What kind of song do I want to write,' and I'll establish that before anything. It helps narrow down the sound of whatever I'm making."

Bowser's most popular song for the first year of his career was the queer anthem "Trans Rights!" The song, a militant rallying cry for trans folks, is fantastic, but it's not the be-all end-all of Bowser's discography. "Being trans isn't the first thing I try to push when I talk about my music," he says. "Obviously, it's real important to me, and my identity is intertwined with my music, but I feel like I've gotten to the point where I can let my music stand for itself. You don't need to be queer to listen to my music."

Central to that accessibility is the earnest respect that Bowser has for the music he makes and the genres they explore. When branching out into a new sound, he will often spend weeks listening to influential artists in that genre, researching the history of that genre, and recalling the music history classes that they took in college. "My thing about genres is that, if I'm going to try out a new one, I want to do it with respect to the years and years of history that that genre has. I want to be respectful to the culture and the roots of the music I make--I have a real big respect for musical history. Any time I approach a new genre, I like to study up. I want to give these genres the respect they deserve."

This reverent mentality to the music they make is self-evident when you put on a Boy Bowser track, or better yet, when you see him perform live. They have plenty of shows this month, including a burlesque show at Club Bleu, two festivals in Long Beach, and a performance at OC Pride. You can find Boy Bowser's music on all major streaming platforms and all social media platforms as @boybowser. A brand new music video for his song "Yes Ma'am" was released on Friday, June 9th, featuring an all-queer, burlesque dancing cast and crew.
